## The Key to Serenity

And acceptance is the answer to all my problems today. When I am disturbed it is because I find some person, place, thing or situation - some fact of my life - unacceptable to me and I can find no serenity until I accept that person, place, thing, or situation as being exactly the way it is supposed to be at this moment. Nothing, absolutely nothing happens in God's world by mistake. Until I could accept my alcoholism I could not stay sober: Unless I accept life completely on life's terms I cannot be happy. I need to concentrate not so much on what needs to be changed in the world as on what needs to be changed in me and in my attitudes.

By accepting and loving myself I am also accepting and loving God. Today I am focusing on the little things I do right. Picking up a piece of trash or smiling and saying "hi" to a stranger. If I focus on the small things I do right everyday, if I focus on the ordinary miracles of daily living, then **maybe** I will gain clarity and strengthen my connection to a power greater than myself.

*Above is another one of my favorite parts of the Big Book along with a paragraph I wrote about accepting myself, warts and all. I know I included this in the April Grape-SCCIN last year but sometimes I need to read the same things over and over before I can even begin to get it right.*

## A word to drop: "Blame"

When I did my Fourth Step, following the Big Book guidelines, I noticed that my grudge list was filled with my prejudices and my blaming others for my not being able to succeed and to live up to my potential. I also discovered I felt different because I was black. As I continued to work on the Step, I learned that I always had drunk to rid myself of those feelings. It was only when I sobered up and worked on my inventory, that I could no longer blame anyone.

## Hospitals and Institutions (H&I)

Interested in being of service? H & I has lots of service positions available. Si Se Puede is in need of secretaries with six months of sobriety, Spanish not required. Mondanaro-Baskin Center is looking for female secretaries with at least six months of sobriety. Juvenile Hall is also in need of a coordinator. You must have one year of sobriety, must be 18 or older, and not be on probation or parole.

If anyone is interested in service work at any of the jails in Santa Cruz County they are all in need of help. You must attend an orientation, which is held the last Wednesday of each month, at the Main Jail Facility, 259 Water Street, Santa Cruz, CA, 95060. Blaine Street Women's Jail has a sobriety requirement of two years and you must be female. Water Street Jail Men's Facility requires you be a male with three years of sobriety, five years since your last felony, and that you are not on parole or probation. To serve at the Water Street Jail Women's Facility you must be female with at least three years of sobriety and not be on parole or probation. The Watsonville Farm is looking for a male secretary with three years of sobriety who is not on parole or probation.
